## Paul an Apostle of Jesus Christ

From the Desk of Pastor Scott

aul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, according to the promise of life in Christ Jesus, 2 to Timothy, my beloved son: Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

This letter has been described as Paul's "Last Will and Testament." His will was a heritage of spiritual service, not money or goods. He bequeaths that service to his young protege, Timothy. As we read through this inheritance, several things will be observed.

1. This Epistle is Personal. This was written at the end of Paul's ministry to his friend and fellow pastor in the battle of religious life. Paul writes this personal letter to direct Timothy to take over Paul's ministry. It is meant as a transfer of ownership of serving

Christ from Paul to Timothy.

2. This Epistle is Pastoral. The two epistles to Timothy along with the epistle to Titus are known as the Pastoral Epistles. They are written to young pastors in the ministry to give them advice in how

to ministry not theology. If you need that go to Romans or Hebrews.

Rejoice in the resurrection of

Jesus Christ.

3. This Epistle while it is pastoral it is for all of us. We are all part of the Priesthood of believers and as such need a daily walk to live out our theology with others. This is a letter to see you through the week.

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, according to the promise of life in Christ Jesus, 2 to Timothy, my beloved son: Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord. (2 Timothy 1:1-2).

Paul begins most of his epistles with a reference to his apostleship, "that was my calling and I taught you all you need to know to carry it on, is what Paul is telling him.

You might be thinking, "That's all very nice and good, but what on earth has that to do with me? I'm more concerned with passing exams or getting a job or in getting through next week without messing up too bad." Let me assure you that Paul's apostleship has everything to do with you. It relates to you because Paul's ministry was directed toward YOU. This isn't a seminary training but a life training on how to equip yourself for heaven and help other do the same.

Paul's apostleship was a bit different from that of the other apostles, his mission was to take the promise of life in Jesus to the Gentiles. Your work is to bring Jesus with you everywhere you go through the week, others wise you hand Jesus on the cross again. You can only do that if you

know the gospel, not all of scripture but the Gospel and how to apply it to your everyday life. We are to the know the gospel and prepare you heart and mind for heaven and to help each other keep "the Faith."

What is the promise of life in Christ Jesus? That is the gospel. It is the good news that Jesus came to earth to die on the cross for the sins of men. He died the death that we deserved and God judged Him as though He were a guilty sinner. And then He was buried and then He arose from the dead to show that death has been defeated. He now promises eternal life to all who will trust in Him as Lord and Savior. Trust in Him in all things.

Timothy's letters are going to be the subject of my next series of sermons over the up coming year. I hope it bring joy and hope to your person ministry.

## Honoring Our Past as We look to the Future!

#### Persistence Pays

Elder and Woodburn's Presbyterian church's historian Pat Cross kept knocking on the doors, calling, writing letters and even visits to town hall but she did it! We finally have a placard monument honoring the historical significance of Woodburn Presbyterian Church. We are the first church to establish within the town limits or Le-

On Monday May 16th at 11 am Leland town officials and are honoring the church by dedicating the placard the town donated to Woodburn.

#### What this Monument represents.

We will be celebrating our 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary as being the first established church (building) in Leland. The church really began and organized by the families of the area around 1920. Seeing the need in 1920 Dr J.M. Wells organized the first Sunday school held in a neighborhood family's home. See the popularity and the need First Presbyterian Church donated

\$2,000 to the Woodburn group and started the construction of the first building in the Spring of 1923. The first church was in a rented building on the current property on Village Road. The building was erected and finished in 1924 when

it was dedicated. When erected the church did not have electricity until the men of the church worked weekends and nights to wire the church building.

The Cemetery which is located at the rear are of the property was started in 1919 with the need for burial of those who succumbed to the Flu epidemic of 1919. As you may know this pandemic was as much as tragedy as our current Covid pandemic is now.


To celebrate our heritage the town if Leland is dedicating this placard and all are invited to attend.

The Job description is as follows:

#### **Woodburn Presbyterian Church**

#### **Choir Director/Organist**

This position helps develop worship music of Woodburn Presbyterian Church. All work is in consultation with the pastor and worship committee of the session. This is done consistent with the mission, values, and theology of our church. This position will also be the church organist and provides organ / piano music and accompaniment of scheduled worship services and other activities in support of the music ministry of Woodburn Presbyterian Church.

This position is a pivotal role in the life of this church. This position is a strong team player who is considered a full partner with the ministerial and worship committee staff.

#### Job Responsibilities

This is a part time position with a minimum of 2-4 hours per week consisting of the following:

Developing a choir with rehearsal at least one hour to two hours per week in preparation for the Sunday service or other special music programs. (Either Sunday morning or a weekday)

Sunday worship will consist of at least one / two hours for the service. (Typically, only the main worship service one hour from 11am to 12 noon.) The music will be chosen by the pastor with the recommendation from this position. This music consists of traditional and some contemporary programming along with some traditional gospel Christian music.

This position will communicate faithfully with the pastor on a regular basis. This position will also be expected to communicate well and in a friendly manner with the church leadership including the Session, choir members and members of the congregation.

#### Music Competencies

Ability in a wide range of styles of music but more focused on Christian classics (hymns) but can develop a future for contemporary music to be included in the future needs of the worship service.

A high degree of competence on a church organ and piano is necessary.


Some degree of composing, arranging, and writing is a plus.
